Program Objectives

- To provide financial support for medical students to help support their educational endeavors and expenses incurred when applying to dermatology residency.
- I To foster inclusivity in the specialty of dermatology.
- To help boost the number of underrepresented individuals in the field of dermatology.
- To cultivate scholars who not only successfully match into dermatology programs but also develop into future leaders in dermatology.

Required Documents

- ✓ Completed Application Form
- ✓ Personal Statement Outline career goals and commitment to dermatology, with a focus on skin of color.
- ✓ Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Two Letters of Recommendation (LORs) From individuals who can speak to your teamwork, collaboration, and leadership potential.
- Letter of Enrollment & Good Standing Official confirmation from U.S. medical school.
- ✓ Step 1 Transcript
- ✓ Official Medical School Transcript

Eligibility Criteria

- Medical Student Membership Must be an active medical student member of the Skin of Color Society.
- Residency Path Planning to submit an ERAS application for dermatology residency in the application cycle.
- U.S. Medical School Students who will be entering their fourth year of medical school.
- Academic Excellence Demonstrated academic achievement, as evidenced by a strong CV and letters of recommendation.
- Underrepresented in Medicine (URiM)
 Applications are encouraged from individuals
 who are URiM, particularly those with financial
 need. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups.
 - Individuals with disabilities.
 - Members of sexual and gender minority groups (LGBTQIA+).
 - Individuals from underserved or disadvantaged backgrounds, such as:
 - I First-generation college or medical school students.
 - I Those who grew up in rural or lowincome communities.
 - I Recipients of federal assistance programs such as Pell Grants or WIC.
